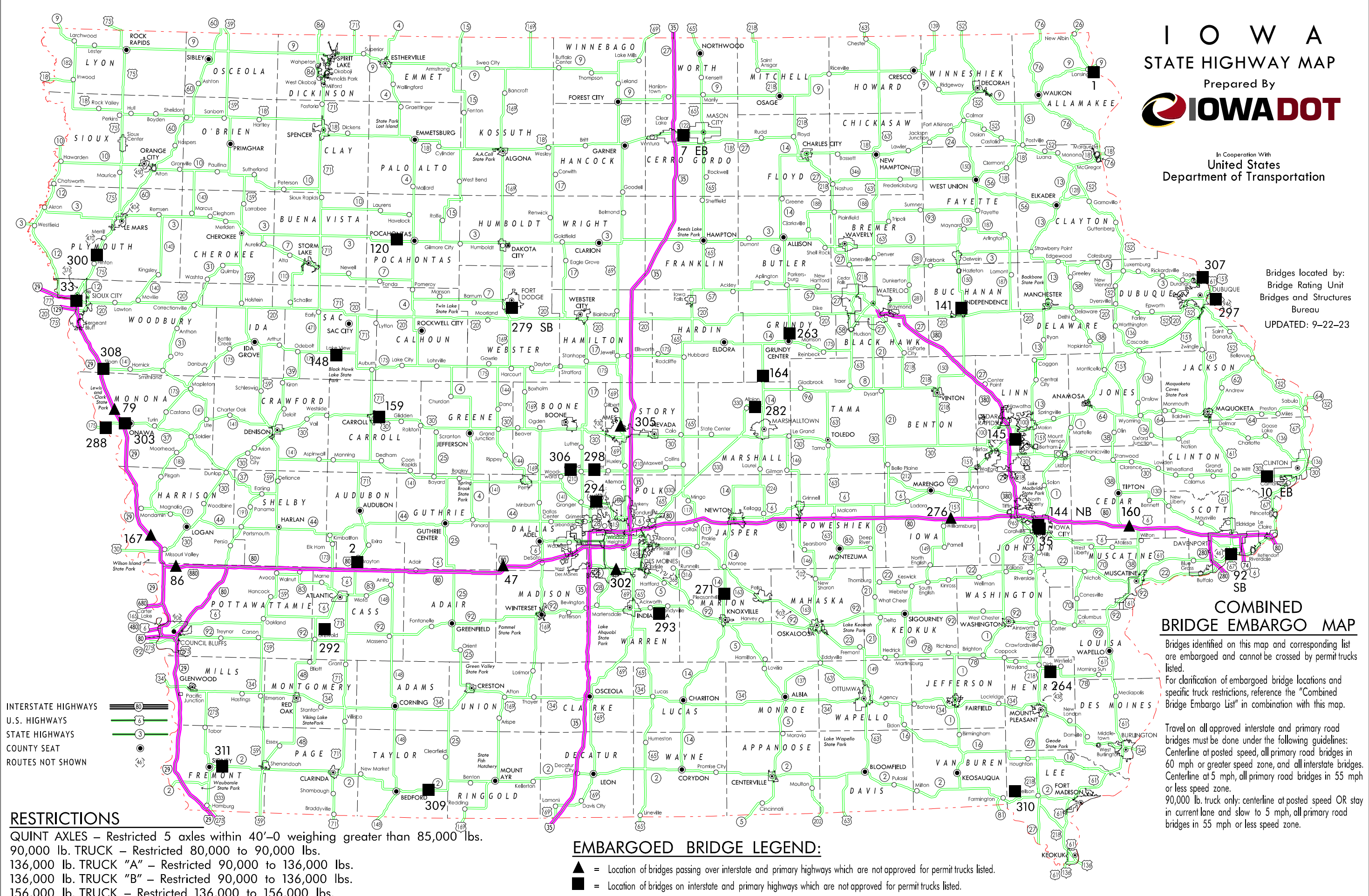

RESTRICTIONS

- QUINT AXLES – Restricted 5 axles within 40'-0" weighing greater than 85,000 lbs.
- 90,000 lb. TRUCK – Restricted 80,000 to 90,000 lbs.
- 136,000 lb. TRUCK "A" – Restricted 90,000 to 136,000 lbs.
- 136,000 lb. TRUCK "B" – Restricted 90,000 to 136,000 lbs.
- 156,000 lb. TRUCK – Restricted 136,000 to 156,000 lbs.

EMBARGOED BRIDGE LEGEND:

- ▲ = Location of bridges passing over interstate and primary highways which are not approved for permit trucks listed.
- = Location of bridges on interstate and primary highways which are not approved for permit trucks listed.

COMBINED BRIDGE EMBARGO MAP

Bridges identified on this map and corresponding list are embargoed and cannot be crossed by permit trucks listed.

For clarification of embargoed bridge locations and specific truck restrictions, reference the "Combined Bridge Embargo List" in combination with this map.

Travel on all approved interstate and primary road bridges must be done under the following guidelines:
 Centerline at posted speed, all primary road bridges in 60 mph or greater speed zone, and all interstate bridges.
 Centerline at 5 mph, all primary road bridges in 55 mph or less speed zone.
 90,000 lb. truck only: centerline at posted speed OR stay in current lane and slow to 5 mph, all primary road bridges in 55 mph or less speed zone.
