

Proposed Iowa 92 southeast of Oskaloosa

Welcome to the lowa Department of Transportation's Public Information Meeting for a potential lowa 92 Oskaloosa southeast connector, in Mahaska County. The purpose of this meeting is to present conceptual alignments as well as the project study area. We would like to listen to your thoughts and ideas, and answer any questions regarding the project. The study area is located southeast of Oskaloosa and extends from lowa 92 and connects to U.S. 63/lowa 163.

STUDY OBJECTIVE

The intent of this study is to evaluate improvement alternatives for a potential lowa 92 connector in the vicinity of Oskaloosa in order to improve the safety and operations of Iowa 92. The proposed improvements may also provide the benefit of a more direct and safe access to both U.S. 63 and Iowa 92 for local business and industrial areas along Iowa 23. Additionally, the proposed improvements are anticipated to reduce truck and passenger vehicular traffic through town.

BACKGROUND

lowa 92 is the primary east-west travel route through Oskaloosa and varies between two, three, and four travel lanes wide. The 2014 traffic volumes on existing lowa 92 through Oskaloosa ranged from 4,800 to 12,700 vehicles per day (vpd) with 4 to 8 percent trucks.

PROJECT SCHEDULE

This project is not currently included in the 2016 to 2020 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), and therefore, no construction schedule has been established. The study is expected to be completed in the spring of 2018, and can then be considered for future funding. Once funding is committed, the DOT can develop design plans so the project can be constructed.



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FIELD STUDIES

As part of the project development process, various field studies will be conducted within the lowa 92 project study area. The lowa DOT may request landowner permission in order for our staff or consultants to gather field information regarding your property. These field studies typically include archaeological sites, historic buildings, wetlands, threatened and endangered species, hazardous waste sites, and land surveys.

RIGHT OF WAY

As part of the proposed improvements, additional right-of-way may be required. The following paragraphs provide information regarding the right-of-way process followed by the lowa DOT. Please keep in mind specific right-of-way needs have not been identified at this time.

lowa DOT policy provides for appraisal of property and/or property rights needed for each project. Professional techniques and methods are used to determine "just compensation" in accordance with federal and state constitutions, laws and regulations. Appraisals are prepared to assure fair treatment for both the property owner and the public.

After completing the appraisal, a right-of-way agent contacts each owner to explain the plans and appraisals and negotiate for the acquisition of the required right-of-way. If an agreement cannot be reached through negotiations, the required right-of-way may be acquired through eminent domain.




