B-29 Bomber Puts on Performance

CEDAR RAPIDS, IA (CBS2/FOX28) -- Sunday was a special day for aviation enthusiasts and people involved with the Eastern Iowa Honor Flight.

A World War II-era B-29 bomber nicknamed "FiFi" put on a spectacular performance at the [Eastern Iowa Airport](#).

The aircraft is the only B-29 in the world that is still flying.

On Sunday, a veteran who served as a gunner on a B-29 during World War II got to sit in the same area he sat in during his flights during the war, and take another ride up.

The B-29 was first flown in 1942 and is best known by many as the aircraft whose missions over Japan helped bring about the end to World War II.
