Commission Comments:

1. Motor Vehicle Enforcement Ride Along

Commissioner Sawtelle said on Monday he had the opportunity to spend time with Mark Lowe, Motor Vehicle Division Director, and the Motor Vehicle Enforcement folks. He spent the morning on the road with Glenn Goode, a Motor Vehicle Enforcement Officer, and got to see what the agency does at the Ankeny campus. It reinforced for him how cutting edge our DOT is with technology that it and lowa State University developed that is now being used across the nation. He noted that while riding with an enforcement officer there was a situation south of Ames with a trucker who had an out-of-service violation which meant he couldn't drive that vehicle for ten hours. It was a small truck with no sleeper so the DOT officer followed him to Ames so he could park at a motel. The officer also talked with the driver about the regulations; and even though this was a gentleman had just signed off on \$250+ in fines and lost ten hours of his work day which was going to affect a crew he had in Kansas, he shook the officer's hand and thanked him for the information. Commissioner Sawtelle said he was very impressed with the professionalism, respect, and customer service. He was also impressed with the way this division has dealt with retirements and is doing its best to maximize human resources with the dollars they have. It was really instructional and he enjoyed the opportunity.

2. Lincoln Way Rail Port

Commissioner Reasner said she and Commissioner Sawtelle attended the dedication for the Lincoln Way Rail port which had a large turnout. She understands this has been planned for a long time and people were happy to see the culmination of those efforts. She noted Union Pacific representatives and Governor Culver were on hand along with some DOT staff including Tammy Nicholson, Office of Rail Transportation. Little did she or Commissioner Sawtelle know they were going to be asked to pick up a large sledge hammer and drive a rail spike into a ceremonial line.

3. Union Pacific Rail Museum in Council Bluffs

Commissioner Cleaveland said he went to the grand opening of the Union Pacific Rail Museum in Council Bluffs.

4. Groundbreaking for the U.S. 34 Extension and new Bridge

Commissioner Cleaveland said he and Nancy Richardson, Director, attended the groundbreaking for the U.S. 34 extension and new bridge off U.S. 34 from Iowa to Nebraska. Director Richardson said there were a lot of people from both sides of the river, the Nebraska Governor, and Lt. Governor Patty Judge. There is a lot of interest in that project.

5. Thank You to DOT Staff

Chairman Wiley expressed appreciation to the DOT staff. This morning wasn't a long workshop but it was important and affects a lot of people when considering all the projects. The Commission can't make those decisions or even understand it without the work done by staff. For the multitude of topics that we talk about and the geographic areas that are covered, it is good to have the information and he expressed appreciation to staff for the work that is done for the Commission to look at things in a comprehensive way.

Craig Markley, Office of Systems Planning, said Orange City submitted a RISE immediate opportunity application to construct approximately 311 feet of 19th Street Southeast and 1,915 feet of Frankfort Place Southeast located in the southeastern part of town just east of County Road K-64. These roadway improvements will provide access to nine lots totaling almost 54 acres of land for industrial use in the Orange City Industrie Centrum. However, based on capital investment, job creation, and the land to be opened by the proposed RISE roadway, it is better suited as a RISE local development project. Under that criterion, this project scored 44 points. The total estimated project cost is \$803,945. The city requests a RISE grant of \$401,973 and will provide a 50 percent local match. He introduced Duane Feekes, Orange City Administrator.

Mr. Feekes introduced Gary Blythe, Assistant City Manager, Orange City. Mr. Feekes briefly reviewed some past successful RISE projects. Their first RISE project was on 14th Street, and since that was done, Quatro, a manufacturer of carbon fiber products, located there and has grown to 73 employees. Across the street, the corporate headquarters for Pizza Ranch has expanded into a small facility. It has been nice to have those roads readily accessible, and they are considering another spec building in that area to expand their opportunities. One of the things they needed was a place where people could go in for a short period of time to be able to do a start up business so that has been a great opportunity for them. They also have a great partnership with their development corporation and are looking to expand that partnership.

Mr. Feekes said the second RISE project was the extension of 19th Street on the south end. Old Masters, a division of Vogal Paints, moved in and has expanded and grown their business into a 30,000 sq. ft. building. Now, Pioneer Hybrid announced they will locate there and are hoping to move into a facility this coming spring. He noted the city currently doesn't have any heavy industrial lots available so allowing this road to be paved gives them the opportunity to market additional property. All total, RISE has created about 135 jobs that are helping Orange City and the surrounding area to grow. All the businesses have either met or exceeded what they anticipated in terms of jobs. He expressed appreciation to the Commission for reviewing their project. He said they have one more step in the process which is to have a public hearing on a change in the zoning and he anticipates that should not be a problem.

Mr. Markley reviewed the recommendation of staff.

Commissioner Sawtelle moved, Commissioner Cleaveland seconded the Commission, based on the capital investment commitment and potential for future job creation, reclassify the project as a RISE Local Development project in the February 2010 round of applications and award a RISE grant of \$401,973 or up to 50 percent of the total RISE eligible project cost, whichever is less, from the city share of the RISE fund. All voted aye.


