

Iowa Streets & Roads Conference  
ACHIEVEMENT in TRANSPORTATION SAFETY AWARD

Purpose:

The purpose of the Transportation Safety Achievement Award is to recognize significant improvements made with physical improvements or programs in transportation safety at the local level. City, County, and the Iowa State agencies are eligible for consideration. The award in the form of a plaque and recognition will be presented at the annual Streets & Roads Conference.

Criteria:

- Nominations must be for improvements made in transportation safety. They may be for an individual, an agency or a program.
- Actual or predicted improvements in traffic safety in some mode of transportation must be demonstrated
  
- Can be related to any or all disciplines including education, enforcement, engineering, or emergency response.
  
- Overall general community safety betterment programs are eligible for nomination as well.

Selections will be judged on the following:

- 30% - Efficiency of improvement concept, (Benefit/Cost, etc)
- 30% - Impact on community, (per cent served or affected)
- 30% - Innovation and originality
- 10% - Community acceptance & involvement (local contribution & support

Procedures:

Nominations can be submitted to the current Iowa Secondary Road Maintenance Association (ISRMSA) president using the Institute for Transportation at Iowa State University address.

Nominations are due by May 1<sup>st</sup> of each year.

Initial screening will be completed by a selection committee (normally the steering committee for the conference) to the top three nominations.

The final selection will be made by ISRMSA and APWA (American Public Works Association-Iowa Chapter) Officers.

Re-nominations in succeeding years may be made.

Except for overall program nominations, only achievements within the last five years will be considered.
