

DOT Administrative Rules Affected by 2009 Legislation

(Please note that other administrative rules may need to be updated. This list does not include all the rule changes that may be needed.)

- SF 356** Section 2 adds a new Code section concerning convictions based upon fraud. This new section establishes procedures for persons who are victims of identity theft to remove driver's license related convictions and offenses from their driver record. The DOT is required to adopt rules to implement this new Code section.
- SF 374** This bill addresses restrictions on the resale and use of motor vehicle operating records furnished by the DOT, clarifies the proper use of a certified abstract of an operating record, and requires the DOT to amend its administrative rules.
- SF 376** Section 34 creates a Bridge Safety Fund under the authority of the Transportation Commission. Moneys in the fund shall be used as appropriated by the General Assembly for infrastructure projects related to functionally obsolete and structurally deficient bridges on the primary road system. The DOT is required to adopt rules to implement Section 34. This bill takes effect upon enactment, May 14, 2009.
- SF 419** Section 25 allows the DOT to adopt rules to implement Code section 321.166, subsection 2. This subsection relates to registration plates.
