



**SPECIAL PROVISIONS
FOR
PEDESTRIAN ACCESSIBILITY ACCOMODATION**

THE STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS, SERIES 2009, ARE AMENDED BY THE FOLLOWING MODIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONS. THESE ARE SPECIAL PROVISIONS AND THEY SHALL PREVAIL OVER THOSE PUBLISHED IN THE STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS.

090186.01 DESCRIPTION.

- A.** Provide 24 hour per day continuous monitoring of the work zone and provide assistance to pedestrians who desire to enter into or navigate through the work zone. Ensure a vehicle and operator traverses the project throughout the entire traffic control zone at all times when sidewalk is obstructed, except for refueling and short rest breaks no greater than 15 minutes in duration.
- B.** Furnish this accommodation any time that signs, barriers, barricades, construction fencing or other traffic control devices are in place that interfere with pedestrian use of the city sidewalk system within the work zone.

090186.02 EQUIPMENT.

Provide a vehicle and operator for this work as follows:

A. Vehicle requirements.

- 1.** The vehicle shall be a minimum seven passenger van equipped with wheel chair lift or another similar vehicle.
- 2.** Contractor's insignia on the vehicle.
- 3.** Adequate weight and power and suitably equipped to traverse through the work zone and entrance slopes at all times.
- 4.** Equipped with an amber revolving light or amber strobe light visible in all directions and a cellular telephone or similar type of mobile phone.

B. Operation.

1. Furnish an operator for the vehicle. Ensure the operator re-erects, repairs, or replaces defective sidewalk traffic control devices immediately upon discovery.
2. Have the operator:
 - a. Be available to assist persons who seek or require assistance commuting from their parked vehicle to their residence within the work zone, and vice versa. Parked vehicles may be located beyond or outside the work zone.
 - b. Provide vehicle transportation for pedestrians who seek to pass through the work zone.
 - c. Provide assistance to pedestrians when construction obstructions create an impediment to pedestrian traffic.
 - d. Summon further assistance if needed.
 - e. Keep a daily log of the number of pedestrians who were assisted on forms provided by the Engineer. Provide the Engineer with a copy of this report daily.
 - f. During anticipated peak pedestrian traffic times, the Engineer may direct the Contractor to provide additional monitoring personnel.

090186.03 NOTIFICATION.

The contractor shall place signs along the project at each side road to inform citizens of the pedestrian service being provided. The signs shall state, "For Pedestrian Service Call (insert cell phone number)". Also, the contractor shall provide written notification to all residents abutting the project of this pedestrian service and the phone number to call to request its use.

090186.04 METHOD OF MEASUREMENT.

Calendar days based on the contract quantity. Additional personnel required by the Engineer to provide additional pedestrian facility monitoring will be measured in calendar days per person needed.

090186.05 BASIS OF PAYMENT.

Payment will be at the contract unit price as described below.

- A. Per calendar day for the number of calendar days used.
- B. This payment is full compensation for:
 - Furnishing the necessary vehicle (including operation, maintenance, and supplies),
 - Furnishing the operator,
 - Providing assistance to pedestrians,
 - Documentation of pedestrian assistance,
 - Summoning further assistance when needed, and
 - All signing and written notification required to inform citizens of the availability of pedestrian service.
- C. Payment for the number of calendar days that additional personnel are required by the Engineer will be the contract unit price per calendar day. Payment is full compensation for furnishing the required personnel and necessary support vehicles.
