Cover Picture... The Herbert Hoover Presidential Library and Museum, is located just a few hundred feet north of Interstate 80 in West Branch, Iowa. Housed in this beautiful building are the papers, books and historical mementos of the first president born west of the Mississippi River.

In addition to the Library and Museum, other points of interest include the little cottage where Herbert Hoover was born, the Quaker Meeting House in which he worshipped as a boy, his father's blacksmith shop and the graves of President and Mrs. Hoover.

A few minutes drive west from this National Historic Site are Iowa's first Capitol in Iowa City and the seven villages of the famous Amana Colonies.

HOW TO USE THIS DISTANCE TABLE: Follow down the vertical column under the name which is first in alphabetical order until it intersects the horizontal column opposite the second name. This figure is the distance in miles between the two cities. For example, the distance between Ames and Davenport is 171 miles.
