International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA)

**IFTA First quarter
2017 tax return deadline
Monday, May 1, 2017**

Online processing is required for all IFTA quarterly tax returns.

Supported Internet browsers are Microsoft® Internet Explorer® (IE) Google Chrome™, or Mozilla® Firefox® – newer IE versions may need to run in the compatibility mode. You must allow **pop-up windows for the online IFTA/IRP applications to work.**

Use the same Account ID (client ID) and password you use to file your IRP renewal and supplements online. **Don't wait until the last minute to request a password – all you have to do is** email omcs@iowadot.us and provide your Client ID number, your email address where a temporary password can be emailed, and your telephone number.

To file online: 1) Go to www.iowadot.gov/iftairp; and 2) The next window to appear is the “hub” of the online application where you will sign in to the application and find the “IFTA online reference guide.” It is recommended you go through the reference guide and FAQs for any questions you may have. Detailed steps on completing the IFTA tax return are in this guide. Follow each step until you have entered all of your information, once complete, proceed until you come to the **payment collection screen**, once you have reached this screen, your tax return has been successfully filed. If you are sending payment in, you will select “Quit” at the bottom of the screen. If you are paying online with Dwolla, you will select “pay with Dwolla” located on the lower right hand side. If you are paying with escrow, you will select “payment type – Escrow”, enter the amount being paid and click proceed on each screen until a PDF of your tax return showing payment made pops up. If you have a zero report, click on proceed on each screen until a PDF of your tax return showing payment made pops up.

To avoid penalty and interest payments must be made in full and in a timely manner. Acceptable methods of payment:

- Dwolla (online payment option).
- Escrow account (online payment option).
- Check, money order, or cashier check.
- *Credit card (\$2.50 or 3.75 percent fee added, whichever is greater).
- *T-check, Comcheck, or electronic funds source (EFS) check number.

IFTA 2017 Renewal & Decal processing: Thank you all for your patience with the processing and distribution of the 2017 IFTA license & decals. As of February 13, all 2017 licenses & decals have been mailed.

IFTA RECORD RETENTION: Distance and fuel documents must be kept for four years from the tax return due date or filing date, whichever is later.

2018 IFTA DECAL DISPLAY CHANGE: IFTA ballot #2-2016 passed with an effective date of Feb. 10, allowing carriers to display their IFTA decals two months prior to the effective date of Jan. 1. This means carriers will be allowed to display their 2018 IFTA decals beginning Nov. 1.

International Registration Plan (IRP)

Motor Carrier Responsible for Safety (MCRS): All IRP commercial motor vehicles (CMVs) registered within a Performance and Registration Information Systems Management (PRISM) State must have a MCRS assigned to it.

- If you indicated the MCRS is not going to change during the registration period, the MCRS information will be printed on the cab card.
- If the MCRS changes during the registration period, the changes must be made with our office within ten days, on the vehicle(s) affected, and a current lease agreement provided.
- If you indicated the MCRS is going to change during the registration period, the MCRS information will not be placed on the cab card. This means the driver must have in his or her possession appropriate documentation (a current cab card, lease agreement and shipping document) to present if stopped at roadside.
- If the MCRS changes are due to a Federal out of service order, you must make the change with our office immediately, and provide a current lease agreement between you and the company with whom you are leasing.

IRP Reporting periods and credential information

1. The distance reporting period for registrants whose IRP renewal is September 2016 or after, is **July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016.**
2. The 2290 reporting period is **July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017.**
3. 2018 credentials must be displayed on/before your current credentials expire. If the 2018 credentials are displayed prior to your current credentials expiring, both the 2017 **and** 2018 cab cards must be carried in the vehicle.
4. If you are deleting a unit from your fleet at renewal time, and you have permanent plates, those plates **must** be returned or postmarked on or before the last day of your renewal expiration month. Failure to return the permanent plates could result in losing your ability to obtain permanent plates. If you have annual plates, they do not need to be returned during renewal time unless you are storing your unit. If you are deleting a unit anytime during the year other than your renewal month, you **must** return the annual **and/or** permanent plates.

IRP RECORD RETENTION: Distance documents must be kept for the distance reporting period of July 1 through June 30 that corresponds to the current registration year, plus the three previous registration years.

Unified Registration System (URS) – Suspended indefinitely

Continue to check our website for updated information.

Federal rule making created the URS system to be implemented in stages. The purpose of the URS is to replace certain existing federal systems with a single, online, federal system. Below are some of the changes that are currently in effect:

All NEW carriers need a Portal account with FMCSA to access URS. For training and information go to: <https://portal.fmcsa.dot.gov/training/Company>

- A new MCSA-1 form has replaced the current MCS-150 form for new applicants.
- Any paper applications received will be sent back to the applicant.
- Existing entities will continue to use the current process.
- USDOT numbers for INTRASTATE carriers will remain at no-charge.

FMCSA Electronic Logging Device (ELD) rule.

The ELD rule is intended to help create a safer work environment for drivers, and make it easier, faster to accurately track, manage, and share records of duty status (RODS) data.

For carriers using AOBRDs (automatic onboard recording devices) before the rule compliance date of Dec., 18, 2017, the rule will replace AOBRDs with ELDs over a four-year implementation period.

An ELD synchronizes with a vehicle engine to automatically record driving time, for easier, more accurate hours of service recording.

The rule applies to most carriers and drivers who are required to maintain RODs.

Carriers and drivers who are using paper logs or logging software must transition to ELDs no later than Dec., 18, 2017.

Carriers and drivers who use AOBRDs prior to the compliance date must transition to ELDs no later than Dec., 16, 2019.

Although ELD devices can be great, not all are created equal, as with anything, you must ensure the ELD you choose will meet all of your record keeping requirements.

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Unified Carrier Registration (UCR)

Each year, interstate carriers, leasing companies, brokers, and freight forwarders who cross state lines while operating a self-propelled or towed vehicle on highways in commerce that meets one of the conditions listed below are required to obtain UCR.

- It has a gross vehicle weight rating or gross vehicle weight of at least 10,001 pounds, whichever is greater.
- It is designed to transport more than 10 passengers, including the driver.
- It is transporting USDOT-regulated hazardous material that requires placarding.

Filing for UCR

In as little as 10 minutes, carriers can renew and pay for their UCR from any computer or smartphone with Internet access at www.ucr.in.gov. Before you start, be sure you:

- Know the USDOT number.
- Have a credit card or checkbook available
- Be aware that the computer session will timeout if there is significant idle time. If that happens, close the Internet window and begin the process again.

If a carrier is no longer in operation or never crosses state lines and wishes to avoid further UCR renewal notices, the carrier must deactivate or update its USDOT number.

Note: Any power units registered under IRP are subject to UCR fees.

UCR Audits: UCR audits are conducted yearly to verify compliance.

USDOT biennial updates and filing schedule

All persons with an active USDOT number are required to file a biennial update according to the schedule below, by the last day of the month. The FMCSA will issue a warning letter at least 30 days in advance of a biennial update deadline. Failure to complete biennial updates will subject entities to civil penalties of up to \$1,000 per day with a maximum penalty of \$10,000. FMCSA may also deactivate the USDOT number for anyone that fails to comply with updating requirements.

It is recommended that a biennial update is done as soon as the FMCSA letter is received, and prior to renewing your IRP. **If a biennial update is not completed timely all transactions will come to a stop.**

USDOT Biennial Update Filing Schedule

If your USDOT number ends in:	You must file by the last day of:
1	January
2	February

If the next-to-last digit of your USDOT number is odd, file your update every odd-numbered calendar year.

If the next-to-last digit of your USDOT number is even, file your update every even-numbered calendar year.

URGENT: Safety Recall Initiated by Volvo Trucks

The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) is issuing this bulletin based upon a safety recall initiated by Volvo Trucks affecting nearly 20,000 Class 8 motor vehicles, with more than 17,000 affected vehicles in the United States ([click here to view Volvo Trucks' "Safety Recall Alert"](#)). FMCSA has become aware of a critical safety defect that could severely affect the safe operation of these vehicles due to a faulty two-piece steering shaft. This condition can lead to separation of the steering shaft without warning and an immediate loss of steering ability and control which may lead to a vehicle crash. Operators of vehicles affected by the Volvo recall should **take the vehicles out of service as soon as possible**. FMCSA is publishing this advisory bulletin to raise awareness of this issue in order to prevent serious crashes.

FMCSA and State inspectors are advised that certain 2016 and 2017 Volvo and Mack Titan model trucks may be affected by the recall. Volvo has advised that carriers contact the Volvo Customer Support line below to determine what, if any, action is necessary. If FMCSA or State inspectors identify a potentially affected vehicle, the driver should be directed to call the number below *prior* to proceeding, and to follow the instructions provided by Volvo.

In addition to being a serious safety issue, continuing to operate these vehicles could be considered a violation of 49 C.F.R. § 3.6.7, which prohibits operation of a vehicle in a condition likely to cause an accident or a breakdown. Safety demands that operators of these vehicles take prompt and appropriate action to ensure this issue is addressed. Motor carriers that violate applicable regulations may face enforcement action including, but not limited to, civil penalties and a finding that the defect constitutes an out-of-service condition.



Why involve the trucking industry in the fight against human trafficking?

Some of these victims are as young as 11 years old ... some are even younger.

Traffickers targeting truckers as consumers continually move their “goods” along circuits that each covers multiple states.

But truckers, in the course of their daily work – and because they're continually on the move – can help stop this ... through observation, overhearing conversations, being trained in what to look for and by tools and instruction on what to do.

Truckers Against Trafficking

Truckers Against Trafficking (TAT) ® began in March 2009 as an initiative of Chapter 61 Ministries to educate, equip, empower and mobilize members of the trucking industry on the critical role they can play in fighting one of the most lucrative and destructive crimes in the United States and globally.

Today, TAT is a 501c3 organization with three main goals to accomplish our mission:

- Have our TAT materials made a regular part of training/ orientation for members of the trucking industry, so when they suspect human trafficking, they'll call the National Human Trafficking Resource Center (NHTRC) at 1-888-373-7888 and report what they know.
- Partner with law enforcement to facilitate the investigation of human trafficking.
- Marshal the resources of the trucking industry to combat this crime.

We provide a website, www.truckersagainsttrafficking.org; a trucking-industry-specific training DVD; webinars; human trafficking presentations; wallet cards truckers can carry with information to help them recognize trafficking and call the NHTRC number when it is suspected; posters and other materials the trucking industry can use for publicity and promotion; and the Freedom Drivers Project — a 48' mobile exhibit designed to educate audiences about the realities of domestic sex trafficking and how the trucking industry is combating it.

TAT also works to build coalitions between members of law enforcement, anti-trafficking organizations and key industry stakeholders, including general managers of truck stops and travel plazas, large carriers and state trucking associations, to further the apprehension of traffickers and the recovery of victims. We interact with appropriate state and national agencies to have our materials used in all venues involving trucking and strategize with state and local law enforcement and government on additional ways the trucking industry can provide invaluable help. And we continually strive to help the trucking industry develop its unique contribution and leadership in the fight against human trafficking.

UPDATE: The Iowa Motor Vehicle Enforcement (MVE) conducted five outreach events recently, with two more in the coming weeks, one of which will be at the Iowa Motor Truck Associations “Safety Professional Conference” in Des Moines. Captain Scott Knudtson, Sgt. Kevin Killpack, and Officer Josh Dagit have been working very hard across the state building outreach events at Travel Plaza's.

MVE continues to provide human trafficking awareness at every safety seminar taught, which included over 150 educational programs to trucking companies across the state last year, and over 7,000 commercial drivers.
